Communication mechanism

Establishment of an efficient team and planning a satisfactory mode of communication is one of the basic qualities of a good project management structure. It is teamwork. It ensures that all the team members and stakeholders have complete information regarding the project. And for this purpose, it is the duty of project manager to conduct regular meetings with the team members, stakeholders, and top-level management.

Project Plan

Project plan plays a vital role in successful project management. It is the responsibility of the project manager when designing a project plan to make sure that he included all client-centred design; best methods and techniques according to the client requirements.

A project plan involves features such as objectives, outcomes, scope, budget, teamwork, scheme,

assumptions, dependencies, premises, risk assessment, and management.

Above all, a project plan defines a complete set of activities that are to be performed by all the team members. The project plan must be updated accordingly if the sponsor requests some new changes in the final product. Depending on the project needs, all the decisions have to be taken by the project manager. Then the project manager may also include a charter agreement in their project plan. A project charter is an official form, which is signed by the project sponsor.

Project Phases

A project lifecycle goes through six phases:

- 1. Project Definition:** Defining the aim, objectives, outcomes and goals, and success aspects for the project.
- 2. Project Initiation:** To set up everything in the project before starting further work on the project.
- 3. Project Planning:** Detailed patterns about the management including time, cost and resource assessment.
- 4. Project Execution:** Complete the work defined in the project management plan to provide the product, service or desired outcome. A perfect implementation is required for effective project management.
- 5. Project Monitoring & Control:** The projects are usually monitored by the project managers, ensuring that a project stays on track and taking corrective actions if it does not.
- 6. Project Closure:** Approval of the deliverables and scattering of all the essential components required to run the project.
